US Postal Service Informed Delivery

As we all know, Erwin Farms uses community mailboxes that require residents to go to a central location to get their mail. This can be an inconvenience, especially if a special trip is made only to find the mailbox empty or filled with 'junk mail'. To help, the US Postal Service provides a service called Informed Delivery, which will provide a digital picture of anything delivered to your mailbox on a given day. The service is free and can be accessed online at <u>USPS.com</u>. You will be required to create an account (it's free and easy to do), then you can enroll in Informed Delivery through the Preferences tab. The entire process can be done in 10 minutes or less. It is recommended that you take advantage of this very useful service.



Safety Committee Helpful Hints

Our community is growing and getting better all the time. Unfortunately, that rapid growth also increases the risk of our being victims of burglary. Here is a list of things we can do to protect ourselves and our property. This information has been compiled from various sources, including websites devoted to Home Security such as safewise.com, porch.com, simplisafe.com, and others.

1. Keep your doors locked! A surprising number of sources indicate that many times burglars walk into a home through an unlocked front or back door. Lock the doors and windows every time you leave, even for a short time.

2. Install an active alarm system and use it. This is the number one deterrent listed by security sources. An alarm sounding will cause the burglar to leave immediately.

3. Keep the outside well lit. This is an issue in our community due to a scarcity of street lighting. Burglars prefer to work in the dark so that they can't be seen while attempting to break into a home.

4. Keep shrubbery and landscaping away from windows and doors. Try to keep windows and doors in plain sight, not blocked by high bushes.

5. Have a dog. Most sources say that burglars avoid homes with dogs, even if they are small dogs. Small, medium, and large dogs can all bark and scare away a burglar.

6. Don't let your home look empty. Having a TV or radio on during the day gives the impression that someone is home, and usually will discourage a burglar. If you will be gone overnight, have timers on some lights to make the home look occupied. Most sources cautioned against having the TV or radio on too loud, or leaving it on all night, as this might seem odd and let the burglar know that no one is really home.

7. Don't let newspapers or mail accumulate in the yard. Have a neighbor pick up papers or packages that may be left on the porch while you are away.

8. Don't give workers too much information about your activities. Unfortunately, not everyone who comes into our homes to do work is completely honest. There is no reason to discuss your planned weekend out-of-town trip in front of strangers.

Which leads to our recommendation for the best way to protect yourself:

9. GET TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBORS AND WATCH OUT FOR EACH OTHER!
